Assisted Liberty, a possible alternative mean?

Considering the importance of promoting socio-educative actions that generates alternatives to the internment of teenagers in conflict with the law and that the Assisted Liberty (A.L.), as this means, for sure constituted, as an educative place, intends related in this research, show an experience taken place by the Occupational Therapy trainees in the city of Sorocaba, with law-breaking teenagers in the Assisted Liberty regimen. There were realized several activities with adolescents as cinema, music, photography, drawing, visit to the contemporary art museum in Sao Paulo city, debates with representatives of the hip-hop and landless people movement. The receiving, the listening, the choice of the activities by the adolescents, and the bond have resulted in interest, participation and spontaneous frequency of them. The actuation of The Occupational Therapy in the regimen of A.L. can promote places of possibilities with the adolescents as the development of autonomy, of the critic and reflexive thought, the exploration of imagination and creativity, without taking the teenager of his social conviviality, because the A.L. is a strengthening mean the familiar and communitarian bonds, besides the participation of the youths in programs and services in the educational area, health, leisure and vacancies in the work field. It reinforces as well a strategy of sensitization of the public opinion and of the service nets to break with the segregation and exclusion practices characterized by the internment.
