

"Calidad Educativa Continua en Terapia Ocupacional, un acercamiento para comprender nuestra profesión"

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The project "Quality in Occupational Therapy Continuing Education", held at the Institute of Rehabilitation Sciences and the Movement for a research team of Occupational Therapists, seeks to reflect the learning process (and quality) of the current and future therapy job at the Universidad Nacional San Martín (UNSAM) in Argentina. This house of studies was the site of the first National School of Occupational Therapy (ENTO) in the country.

It aims to systematize the process of growth and development of educational quality, addressing the needs of health and assisted local contexts of practice with the knowledge, expectations and standards of discipline (WHO, UNESCO, CIF, World Federation of Occupational Therapists) to further improve the current processes of learning from changes in specific subjects.

The project was organized in 3 stages, to facilitate its implementation:

- 1- Bibliographical. Survey data. Revision of the curriculum. Seminars and outreach programs, among others.
- 2- National and international seminars. University outreach. Participation in scientific activities. Teacher Training.
- 3- Create a newsletter. Community Services. Publications. Assessment.

This project joins a student at the University who won a "Training Scholarship for University Students" issued by the Committee on Scientific Research (CIC) of the Government of the Province of Buenos Aires. It is part of the research group to perform tasks required by the research project and own the plan of activities proposed for the scholarship.

Is proposed for the presentation of a poster, a comparative table of the analysis of the results achieved so far after implementing the first two phases of the project, which is explained the scope and benefits to the profession which was achieved, namely:

- Reorganization of Teachers Tasks.
- Curriculum.
- Publications (3 publications)
- Scientific Activities
- Library Service
- Graduates
- University Extension Service (Scientific Workshops Open to the Community, Draft Historical Review of Occupational Therapy).
