

IMPLANTATION OF REHABILITATION ACTIONS IN THE FAMILY HEALTH PROGRAM/PSF OF THE ZERBINI FOUNDATION AND THE MUNICIPAL HEALTH OFFICE OF SÃO PAULO - SOUTHEAST REGION/SAPOPEMBA/VILA PRUDENTE - PERIODO 2000/2006

This is the result of research financed by the CNPq/National Counsel of Scientific and Technological Development/Ministry of Science and Technology/Brazil (July/2005/June/2008) that evaluated the implementation of rehabilitation actions in the Strategy of Family Health(ESF)/Municipal Health Office in the region of Sapopemba/Vila Prudente/São Paulo/Brazil (October/2000-December/2006).

The rehabilitational intervention began in October of 2000 with a staff of (3)physiotherapists, (3)speech therapists, and (3)occupational therapists who developed actions in articulation with the family health staffs. The objectives of this study were: to systematize and analyze the data of the institutional documents of the ESF (2000/2006); analyze the implantation of rehabilitation actions in the integral health care, according to technical staffs, users, families and people from the community and research in the national and international literature rehabilitation experiences in basic care. Method used:qualitative approach applied to health problems, considering the qualitative data attached to the content analysis. As a result, the following was obtained: narration of the history of the project implantation; making the specificities of its organization in the different years explicit; identification of the results in the different health units(9) reached by the project; characterization of the productivity; identification of the rehabilitation actions that facilitate its entirety; identification of the rehabilitation actions that favor the dismantling of the social exclusion processes; identification of interoffice actions and with the social movements for the handicapped/incapacitated population; recommendations for the restructuring of the actions in the ESF. Thus, the experiment: radically broke off with the rehabilitation proposals of traditional institutions as far as its organization and operating mode; it is rich in successful organizational proposals; presents implementation diversity of permanent educational processes; successfully develops diverse intervention actions; is concerned with intersectorial work; partly guarantees users' access to the services; provides entirety in the health actions; presents solid team work, with some shared actions among the diverse professionals and attempts of interdisciplinary actions; maintains in the work space the discussion about equality and humanization of the intervention practices, although still in an incipient manner. It is an experiment that subsidizes thinking about the role of the Occupational Therapy in the community and in Basic Care.
