Social Functioning Related to Job Tenure Among People With Schizophrenia

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Objective:

The aim of this study was to explore which social function would affect the job tenure among people with schizophrenia

Method:

There were 68 participants diagnosed with schizophrenia and divided into two groups, employment with 34 people and unemployment with 34 people. We used DANVA II- Taiwan Test, the Hinting Task, the Chinese Version of Interpersonal Personal Problem Solving Skills to test the social information perception, social information processing and social skill sending.

Result:

After all data computed with multiple logistic regression analysis, the social function could be predicted by the Hinting Task. Participants in the employed group had better performance in facial affect recognition, the social information processing and social skills sending. i

Conclusion:

The result indicated employment is affected by the performance of social function among people with schizophrenia.
