

Background

• Complexity of long-term care for person with Spinal Cord Injury (SCI).

• Difficulty finding suitable discharge environments.

• No family support in South Africa = long-term placement problems.

• 2 cases at WCRC – clients repatriated back to home country, Malawi.

Repatriation Process

- Ground work (documentation/family contact) Social Workers at WCRC.
- International Organisation for Migration paperwork, financial support.
- OT and Doctor escorted clients from Cape Town to Blantyre, Malawi.
- Clients transported to Queen Elizabeth Central Hospital for family training.
- Networking with other health care professionals.
- Transport of clients to their homes.



- Limited Occupational Therapists.
