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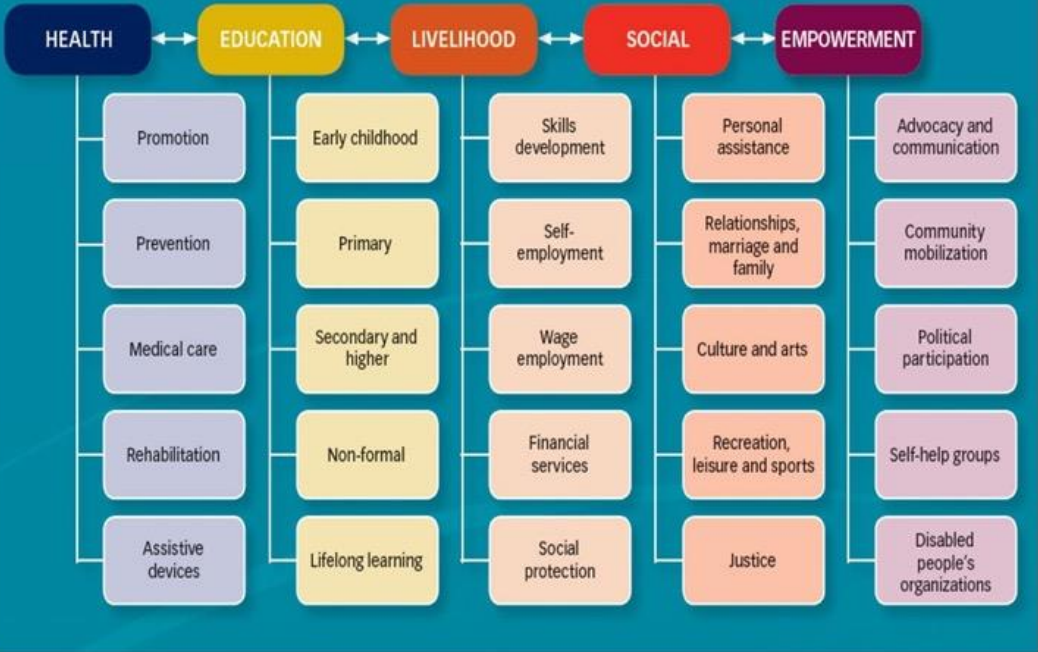

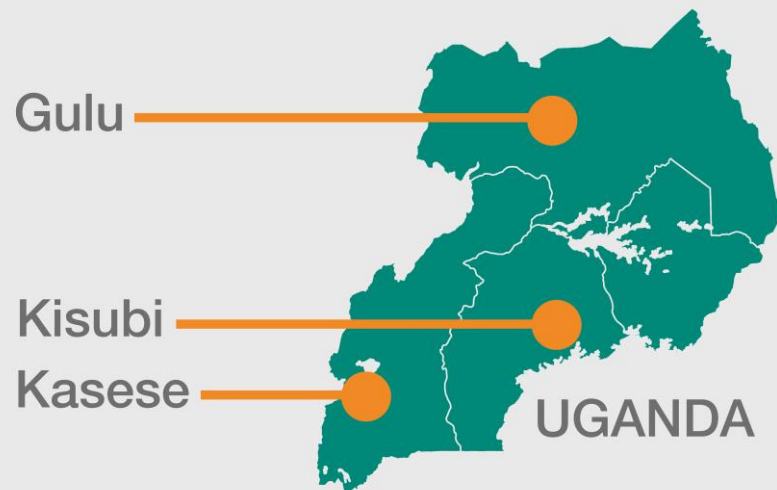

- What role can you play?
- What facilitators are needed for you to achieve this?
